Thank you to Mrs Anna McCann, Relieving Principal from Seven Hills High School for coming along to discuss with parents the transition from Year 6 to Year 7 and what Seven Hills High School has to offer for our students.

Kiss and Drop

Thank you to all the families who have filled out the Kiss and Drop registration forms. There are a number of new families using Kiss and Drop and it does take younger children a few minutes to buckle up in their restraints. Some of our students need assistance, so please be patient as they get accustomed to the process. I am on duty until 3.15pm and if you come to pick your children up a little later there will be less time waiting in a line of traffic. By law children should not sit in the front seat unless they are 7 years old or over. Children 7 years old or younger are required by law to have a car seat or booster seat. A Kiss and Drop registration form has been attached to this week's newsletter.

Please be aware that you are not permitted to park your car in the Kiss and Drop Zone between the hours of 8am to 9.30am and 2.30pm to 4pm. Kiss and Drop is only for dropping your child off and picking them up. By law you are only permitted to stay for 2 minutes and

School Carparks

School carparks are for **staff use only** please do not park in the carparks to pick up or drop off your children. Parents may enter the top carpark if they are picking up or dropping off for before and after school care only.

School Volunteers

Please remember it would be helpful if all volunteers (including class helpers) could provide a working with children check. It is not a necessity to have a WWCC if assisting in your child's classroom however it allows us to monitor more closely. We currently have more than 30 registered parents that help volunteer for school activities. Those who don't have a WWCC are required to fill in a Declaration for Volunteers and complete a 100 point check.

To register all you need to do is fill a form online at www.kidsguardian.nsw.gov.au/check and then take your proof of identity to your nearest Motor registry, RMS Agency or Service NSW office with your application number. Your approval will be emailed to you within a few days. You will need to print that out and supply it to the school office with your date of birth written on it. A volunteers check is free of charge.





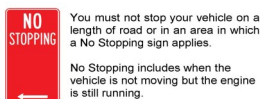

Penalties from 1 July 2015

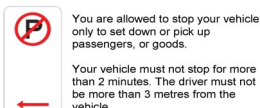


This Fact Sheet provides an overview of some of the penalties that apply to illegal parking on all roads in **School Zones**

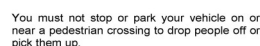

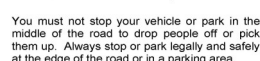
If you disobey a 'No Parking' sign
- Fine from \$177 + 2 demerit points



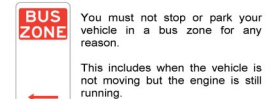
If you stop on or near a 'Pedestrian Crossing' - Fine from \$425 + 2 demerit points



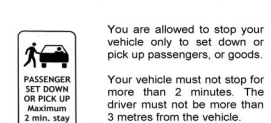
If you are Double Parked - Fine from \$319 + 2 demerit points

Short Description of Positions for the P & C Committee

President & Vice-President – The President shall preside at all meetings, in the absence of the President, the Vice-President shall preside. The President shall represent the P & C Committee. at SHNOOSH Committee meetings. The P & C President is required to prepare a report each month to each P & C meeting.

Secretary – The Secretary shall attend meetings and keep a record of all business conducted. The Secretary is required to maintain incoming and outgoing correspondence and report to the P & C Committee meeting each month.

P & C Treasurer – The Treasurer shall receive and deposit monies, maintain records, draw cheques and present accounts to each General Meeting; present all records for auditing each year. The P & C Treasurer is required to prepare a report for the P & C Committee meeting each month.

Fundraising Co-ordinator – The Fundraising Co-ordinator is responsible for overseeing all fundraising activities undertaken for the benefit of raising funds for our school. The Fundraising Co-ordinator is entitled to recruit additional help with fundraising events at their discretion. This person is required to provide a report to the P & C Committee meeting each month.

Uniform Co-ordinator – The Uniform Co-ordinator is responsible for stocktaking of all uniform items held on the school property at least once per school term. The Uniform Co-ordinator is required to provide a report to the P & C Committee meeting each month.
