From the Principal's Desk

Athletics carnival

We are busy preparing for our Athletics Carnival, to be held on Wednesday 23 June for all students K-6. It is a fun day with separate activities for K-2 students as well as all the traditional carnival events for students aged 8 and up.

We are looking forward to having our family and friends join us on the day. A coffee van will be at the grounds in the morning for adults only, from approximately 10-11am. A reminder that there are NO canteen facilities available, although our Year 6 students will be selling lollies and chips as a fundraiser for the Year 6 farewell. We will need some adult volunteers to help on the day. We require 15 adults for each of the K-2 and 3-6 carnivals, to help run Tabloid Activities (K-2) and to help as group managers of students as they move around the Field Events (3-6). For students turning 8 years old and above, there will be the opportunity to participate in the 100m, 200m and long jump. To participate in high jump, discus and shot put, parents/carers are required to provide permission for their child/children to participate. All children participating in high jump are allowed to do the 'scissor kick' technique. However, students need to be trained and permission granted for them to do the more technical 'Fosbury Flop' (as required by Department of Education School Sports Unit safety regulations). Permission notes for student entry in these field events are due by Tuesday 15 June.

Semester 1 Reports

As Term 2 draws to a close, teachers are very busy writing Semester 1 reports. Teachers have worked extremely hard this term to assess student achievement and report student progress accordingly. Teachers use a number of standardised, school-based and anecdotal assessment forms to determine student progress. Some important points for parents to remember are:


- Our school uses a five point achievement scale to report to parents for students in Years 1 to 6. Achievement is judged in relation to syllabus standards. This point scale is defined in the table below.
- Reports provide achievement in the six Key Learning Areas of English; mathematics; creative arts; human society and its environment (which includes history and geography); personal development, health and physical education; and science and technology.
- **SOUND** is the expected achievement level that most students should achieve in all learning areas. The reports are a POINT IN TIME report. This means that we only report on what has been taught and assessed over Term 1 and Term 2. Therefore, it is possible that your child has performed differently during this reporting period and may receive a different level to previous reports.

Attendance Matters

When your child attends school every day, learning becomes easier and your child will build and maintain friendships with other children.

Parents and carers can help foster positive attendance habits by:

- helping their child learn the importance of punctuality and routine
- ensuring their child arrives on time from the start of the school day, ready to participate in learning
- reducing disruption to learning where possible, by planning any necessary appointments outside of school time
- promptly communicating any absence to the school (within 7 days of the first day of any absence)
- working with the school to encourage and support regular attendance.




Beach and bath time

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Canteen Coordinators Needed!!

The P&C having been trying to get the canteen up and running but we need 2 Coordinators to run the canteen to ensure its success.

Thank you to all the parents that have sent through the volunteer request and we have not forgotten but we do need 2 people who are willing to run and organise the canteen.

The P&C decision is that moving forward having 2 coordinators will ensure the canteen can remain open if one of the coordinators are unable to run the canteen on any given day.

The P&C is currently seeking a Canteen Supervisor available to volunteer two days a week on a Wednesday and Friday between the hours of approximately 9.00am to 2.30pm.

The P&C is a recognised Centrelink volunteer provider and this unpaid position can now count towards the 15 hours of work per week required to receive Parenting Payments.

Information on the Centrelink website also indicates that people over the age of 55 may also volunteer to meet their Centrelink requirement. Please contact your Centrelink office for more information on what this may mean for you.

The Canteen Supervisor will work closely with our P & C and the volunteers that we already received expression of interests from to assist working in the Canteen.

Criteria: To be considered for this position you must meet the following criteria:

- Experience with food ordering, preparation and service (desirable).
- Ability to prepare, cook and promote healthy foods.
- Ability to lead and support canteen volunteers.
- Ability to manage the takings and work with the P & C Treasurer to oversee canteen finances.
- · Ability to manage and order stock.
- Ability to manage and implement the volunteer roster.
- Applicants must have access to a car and hold a current driver's licence.
- Applicant will be required to obtain a Volunteer Working With Children Check.

STEM X Play with UTS

During Term 2, Stage 3 had the opportunity to work with engineering students and teachers from the University of Technology, Sydney.

Students worked together in small groups over 6 weeks to solve a science-based problem that could be solved using robotics. Problems included water pollution, space junk, transporting vaccines, cyber safety, air pollution, saving wildlife & trees, drought etc.

All students learnt how to code a Sphero or Micro Bit in order to solve their problem. They then created a slideshow to present their design to the rest of Stage 3. They discussed all the goals, steps, strategies and materials relating to their 6 weeks worth of research and development.

This project was a resounding success and we look forward to working with the team from UTS in the future.
