**Staff Professional Learning and School Planning** 

Over the past few weeks, our staff have engaged in professional learning around our School Plan 2018-2020 and the School Excellence Framework. This has provided valuable opportunities for staff to reflect on the achievements of our school and to forward plan our continuing directions and focus areas.

I know I'm not the only one who can't believe that we're only 3 short weeks away from the end of the school year. What a year it has been!

Tomorrow will be my official last day on class before I go on maternity leave and 3/4B will be having a small class party in the middle session tomorrow to celebrate our time together this year and all that the kids have achieved through their hard work and enthusiasm for learning.

Here is a little overview of what we've been doing for the past few weeks:

- Working together with partners to complete a group project on a celebration of their choice from Australia and around the world. These will be presented on Wednesday in class and I know that we're all looking forward to seeing each other's creations!
- Stage 2 Creative Arts afternoons, which finish this week with our last Dance lesson
- Continuing on with our 'Words Their Way' spelling program and looking deeply into word attack strategies such as syllabification
- Maths-A-Palooza last week was a real hit with the kids spending the morning session revising their knowledge about various measurement concepts. The kids loved getting to work with Miss Cooper and playing with water in the classroom to complete the volume and capacity activity.
- We've started delving deeper into comprehension attack strategies when responding to questions about a given text including skimming and scanning, vocabulary work, summarising, questioning, predicting and several others. It has been so great to watch how their confidence in this area has grown compared to the beginning of the year.
- We have continued to focus on Creative Writing this term and will turn our focus to descriptions and poetry for the remaining few weeks.
- This term's topic talks were fantastic with all students showing improvement and a clear responsive to the 'bump it up' goals that were given after their Term 3 speeches. Well done everyone!

I speak from the bottom of my heart when I say that it has been an absolute honour being the teacher of 3/4B this year. I have loved getting to know each of the kids and their families and will miss everyone dearly next year.
